

## **UNIVERSITY PARK POLICE DEPARTMENT: TRAINING JANUARY - DECEMBER 2018**

All sworn police personnel completed mandatory Maryland Police and Corrections Training Commission (MPCTC) in-service training (24 hours each officer) in May, September and October 2018. Topics included Use of Force updates; Tactical Communication Skills; Tactical Patrol Techniques; Surviving Ambushes; Domestic Terrorism and General Legal Updates.

All sworn personnel completed annual \*firearms classroom/range qualification as mandated by MPCTC on October 29, 2018 (8hours each officer).

- 12 Ga Slug - 4 rounds (Only 2 officers requested to be qualified)
- 12 Ga Buck - 16 rounds (Only 2 officers requested to be qualified)

**In 2018 there were 10 training classes attended along with In-Service and Firearms training for a total of approximately 619 hours of training.**

## **UNIVERSITY PARK POLICE DEPARTMENT: CODE COMPLIANCE**

**January - December 2018**

The Code Compliance function of the Town of University Park is handled by a Code Compliance Officer which involves daily interaction with residents and property owners. The Code Compliance Officer provides information dealing with rental property, code issues, permit issues and other general property related questions. The Code Compliance Officer provides responsive service to the Town and its residence and serves as a reference to answer questions regarding the town ordinance and the permitting process for the Town of University Park and Prince George's County. In 2018 the Code Compliance Officer took the following actions:

- Responded to approximately 550 inquiries from town residents.
- Conducted 78 rental inspections
- Performed 43 rental re-inspections
- Issued 15 violation notices
